

FORWARD COSCULOR WITH INTEGRITY AND POWER

he church is not static. It is dynamic, and comprises people on the move. However, this forward movement is not self-directed as we are under holy orders. Jesus Christ is the Head of the church, and it is He who sets the mission and agenda.

Let us note that the power of the church does not rest in its material wealth or in its organisational structure. As a church, we can operate with seamless efficiency and amass great material wealth, but still be a weak and ineffective body of people.

The theme for the convention indicates that the forward movement of the church is not propelled by a popular cultural wave, or driven by the wind of political correctness. The direction the church takes is guided by the timeless and enduring truths of God's Word and the wisdom and power of the Holy Spirit. This means that the path taken by the community of Jesus Christ is one marked by moral courage and selfless service, in an age defined by compromise and self-centredness.

In such an era, moral purity is not an option for believers. We are called to be God's holy people because our God is holy.

"But as He which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; because it is written, 'Be ye holy; for I am holy,'" (1 Peter 1:15-16).

Holiness remains God's uncompromising standard for His people. God not only calls us to holy living, but holiness is modelled for the believer as we observe how God deals with nations and individuals.

The scriptures denounce all forms of immorality, idolatry, and injustice. Moving forward with integrity is, therefore, not just a high-sounding declaration, but a commitment to the practice of holiness.



The mission of the church can only be fulfilled through the power of the Holy Spirit. The proclamation of the Gospel and the making of disciples cannot be achieved effectively without the enablement of the Holy Spirit.

To be salt and light means that the church is required to push back at darkness and take a courageous stance against anti-God forces and systems. For us to accomplish this goal, we must understand that the church is more than buildings and ceremonies; we are God's redeemed and empowered people who are called forth to show light. (1 Peter 2:9).

I am confident that the obstacles in the path of the church, as we seek to move forward, will have to give way when confronted by moral authority and divine power. As a church, we continue to march forward in victory

with our steps ordered by the Lord, our hearts cleansed by God's Word and our hands empowered by the Spirit.

BETHEL BIBLE COLLEGE OF THE CARIBBEAN – JAMAICA

Thruthe Sin testing times

College of the Caribbean – Jamaica was faced with the dilemma posed by COVID-19, there was perhaps much apprehension as to the future of young pastors in training.

Today, not only has the college pivoted seamlessly into online teaching and learning practices, but it has been able to thrive in the time of adversity.

"We have seen significant increase in student enrolment for the degree and diploma programmes," said Rev. Dr. Donald Roberts, President of the College.

Student enrolment moved from a high of 55 in the 2019/2020 academic year to 73 in the 2020/2021 year.

"We have also seen the successful adjustment of faculty, staff, and students of the College to the realities brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic," said Dr. Roberts.

Despite those positive experiences, however, the College has gone through a number of challenges. Among those were the discontinuation of the residential training of the students, the availability of qualified and experienced lecturers, discontinuation of community ministry by students and disruption of practicum sessions.

However, at the beginning of the 2021/22 academic year, the College will offer a four-year Bachelor of Theology Degree, a three-year Diploma in Theology and a one-year Certificate in Christian Ministry at basic and advanced levels. Those who are applying for the Major in Theology also have the option of reading for a Minor in Guidance and Counselling.

Applicants to the Bachelor and Diploma in Theology are required to matriculate with five Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate(CSEC) or General Council of Education (GCE) O' level subjects, with one of those being English Language. Those interested in the Level 1 Certificate in Christian Ministry are required to have secondary level education and for Level 2, three CSEC or GCE O' Level subjects.

As the college continues to expand its offerings, the administrators are looking forward to the development of Master of Arts degrees in Theology, Christian Ministry, and Church Leadership.

In addition, thought is being given to an additional Bachelor's Degree in Guidance and Counselling and Social Work.

The college plans to conduct a survey later this year in an effort to ascertain which of those programmes are in demand, said Dr. Roberts.

NATIONAL YOUTH AND DISCIPLESHIP DEPARTMENT

Rising 8

For Rev Kevin Page, the National Youth and Discipleship Department is an office of which he can be proud as it continues to fulfil its purpose.

"Currently, the thrust of the Department is to develop our young people through holistic programmes, ... strengthening the youth leaders and workers to help build out this holistic lifestyle through proper application of God's Word," says Rev. Page, who serves as the department's National Director.

He lauds his team members for the valiant effort they have managed to put in, even in the face of the limitations brought about by COVID-19 and which had the leaders of the denomination devising creative strategies to keep the activities going.

The team comprises nine board members, 10 ministry leaders, 77 district directors and 308 local directors.

At the beginning of the church year, there were

a number of items on the agenda and they were able to navigate through each of them.

Each ministry hosted at least one major event for the year, which saw young people showing up in the digital space. For this reason too, Rev. Page expressed his appreciation to the social media team who worked hard to promote the denomination's content online to generate traffic to the various platforms.

While for some, the numbers may not have been what they were accustomed to seeing, the activities were still widely supported.

Students' Link, which took place on October 7, 2020, saw the national director getting a chance to engage students within the denomination on topical issues and the word of God.

Teens' Link, Teens' Week and Teens' Rally were also ticked off from the calendar of events. More than 4,000 young people benefited from those activities.

The Sunday School Department was not to be left out, and so a virtual Sunday school seminar was held earlier this year. Many people, including some from other Caribbean islands and North America, participated.

National Youth Congress lived up to expectations. The flagship event of the Youth Department took place in April 2021, over a three-day period. The streaming platform racked up over 36,000 views and received more than 700 new subscribers.

The church year culminated with the National Children's Service, which took place on May 30, 2021.

As for plans for the upcoming year, Rev. Page said the main aim is continued expansion.

"We are very confident that with God's guidance, we will embrace the new opportunities and challenges that come to us as we seek for the continuous development of the youth ministry of our denomination." he said.
